- Students who use SOC 1200 (6) or both of SOC 1211 and SOC 1221 to satisfy the year one requirements will be required to complete three (3) fewer credit hours in Sociology courses numbered at the 2000 or 3000 level.

These students must come to the Faculty of Arts General Office to formally declare their intention to have their Minor recorded on their transcript.

 The minimum number of credit hours which a student must successfully complete in order to receive an Honours Degree is 120.
