Program Description

The purpose of the Micro-Diploma in Leadership in Action is to provide learners who are interested in leadership as a skill-set to gain a for-credit credential targeted to core knowledge and skills in this domain. It will be attractive to potential students interested in leadership at any level, including those newly serving in leadership roles in the community, business, government, or the voluntary sector.

The Micro-Diploma also offers existing UM students across disciplines with a new opportunity for focused, in-depth leadership education to augment their academic programs and enhance their ability to thrive in their careers in any field.
